RIGHTEOUSNESS IN OUR SEXUALITY

The real trouble with the Pharisees and scribes was that they had never read the Ten Commandments properly. If they had truly considered and studied them, they would have seen that you cannot take each one in isolation. ...The apostle Paul, in his striking statement in Romans 7, confesses that he himself had been guilty of that very error. He says that it was when he realized that the law said, "Thou shalt not covet," that he began to understand the meaning of lust. Before that he had been thinking of the law in terms of action only; but the law of God does not stop at mere action, it says, "Thou shalt not covet." The law had always stressed the importance of the heart... Our Lord, therefore, is anxious to stress that important truth and to impress it upon His followers.

THE SCRIBES' INTERPRETATION (5:27)

"You shall not commit adultery" is the seventh commandment (Ex. 20:13). The scribes taught that the act of adultery was wrong but often ignored the command against coveting and lust (Ex. 20:17).

- Sin is more _____ than we realize.
- Sin is more than we realize.
- Defeating sin requires more ______ action than we realize (cf. Romans 6:11; 8:13; 13:14; 1 Corinthians 6:18).

The beauty and sanctity of marriage is not only threatened by lust in the heart but also by using divorce as a way of legalizing lust.

THE SCRIBES' INTERPRETATION (5:31)

The scribes' teaching on divorce focused on Deuteronomy 24:1-4:

- They turned a *secondary* passage into the *primary* one.
- They turned a permission for divorce into a command.
- They focused on the *legality* of the divorce rather than on its *legitimacy* in the eyes of God (cf. Malachi 2:13-16).

THE KING'S DECLARATION (5:32)

But I say to you

whoever divorces his wife for any reason

except sexual immorality

makes her the victim of adultery

and whoever marries a woman who is divorced commits adultery.

THE DISCIPLES' APPLICATION

- Sex is a good gift, designed by God for one man and one woman, in the security of a lifelong marriage covenant.
- Sexual sin—no matter how I may justify it—harms myself, the other person, and the sacred oneness of marriage.
- Because of the reality of sin, God allows divorce in certain cases where one partner willfully violates the marriage bond.
- God loves. God saves. God forgives. God cleanses. God heals.

Causes you to sin. Greek, skandalizo, "to entrap; trip up; entice to sin." Originally used to describe the "bait stick in a trap."

Sexual immorality. Grk, *porneia*, "any kind of illicit sexual sin."

We have courtesans for pleasure; we have concubines for the sake of daily cohabitation; we have wives for the purpose of having children legitimately and of having a faithful guardian for all our household affairs.

In a society where only men held the power of divorce, Jesus takes that power out of their hands. Jesus only gives the possibility of divorce if the wife willfully violates the marriage bond through illicit sexual behavior (Mk. 10:12). Thus, a godly man (avoiding adultery) married to a faithful wife (avoiding *porneia*) would have no valid reason for divorce.
